THOMAS A. MARKS is Head of Department, War and Conflict Studies (WACS), College of International Security Affairs (CISA) of the National Defense University (NDU) in Washington, DC. He completed his doctoral work in his home state of Hawaii, where for 14 years he was Chair and Professor of Social Science at Academy of the Pacific, a private high school, and – for more than two decades – a highly successful cross country and track coach. He has authored hundreds of publications, to include the benchmark *Maoist Insurgency Since Vietnam*, and served as the Oppenheimer Chair of Warfighting Strategy at the Marine Corps University (Quantico), as well as longtime adjunct professor at AFSOS (Hurlburt Field) and the Sherman Kent School (Washington, DC). Dr. Marks came to CISA as a consequence of 9/11. A former army and US government officer, he subsequently worked as an independent contractor, including for Control Risks of London. This service involved leading a team that trained the Mexican Cabinet bodyguards and field service as operations consultant with a newly raised special tactics unit in Saudi Arabia. It may be added in passing that for a decade during the heyday of *Soldier of Fortune*, Marks was the magazine's Chief Foreign Correspondent. He owes his uneven grasp of sound to a semi-successful effort to deflect an RPG-7 rocket with a head-butt.
